1.5 **256B.072 PERFORMANCE REPORTING AND QUALITY IMPROVEMENT**
1.6 **SYSTEM.**

1.7 (a) The commissioner of human services shall establish a performance reporting
1.8 system for health care providers who provide health care services to public program
1.9 recipients covered under chapters 256B, 256D, and 256L, reporting separately for
1.10 managed care and fee-for-service recipients.

1.11 (b) The measures used for the performance reporting system for medical groups
1.12 shall include measures of care for asthma, diabetes, hypertension, and coronary artery
1.13 disease and measures of preventive care services. The measures used for the performance
1.14 reporting system for inpatient hospitals shall include measures of care for acute myocardial
1.15 infarction, heart failure, and pneumonia, and measures of care and prevention of surgical
1.16 infections. In the case of a medical group, the measures used shall be consistent with
1.17 measures published by nonprofit Minnesota or national organizations that produce and
1.18 disseminate health care quality measures or evidence-based health care guidelines. In
1.19 the case of inpatient hospital measures, the commissioner shall appoint the Minnesota
1.20 Hospital Association and Stratis Health to advise on the development of the performance
1.21 measures to be used for hospital reporting. To enable a consistent measurement process
1.22 across the community, the commissioner may use measures of care provided for patients in
1.23 addition to those identified in paragraph (a). The commissioner shall ensure collaboration
1.24 with other health care reporting organizations so that the measures described in this
1.25 section are consistent with those reported by those organizations and used by other
1.26 purchasers in Minnesota.
